Transition Phrases help connect ideas and examples in writing. The use of transition phrases will allow your writing to flow and improve written organization and clarity.

A great place for transition phrases are within your body paragraphs, connecting your examples. They can be inserted after your **topic sentence**, and at the beginning of your example sentences. *However*, *transition phrases can be used in many other places in your paper*.
